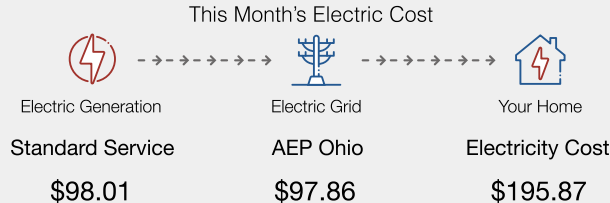

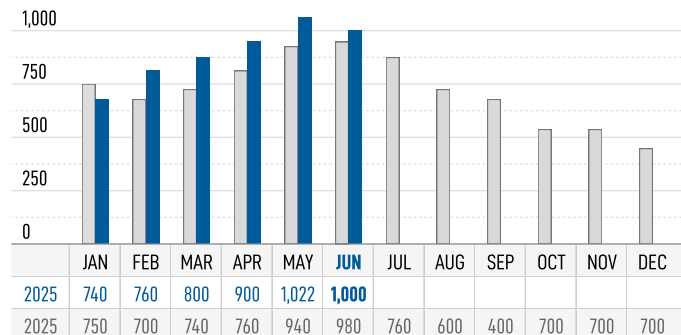

# Your Electric Bill Has Two Parts:

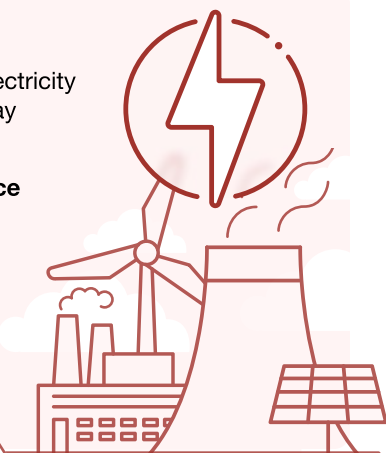
## Electric Generation

This is the cost to generate the electricity you used. Under Ohio law, you may choose your generation provider.

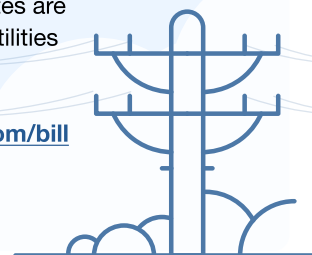

## AEP Ohio Electric Grid

This is cost of the electric grid that delivered electricity from the generator to your location. Under Ohio law, AEP Ohio is the designated “electric distribution utility” that operates the electric grid in your area. AEP Ohio’s rates are reviewed and approved by the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio

## Learn About Your Electric Generation

If you do not exercise your right under Ohio law to choose a generation provider, the electric distribution utility is required to provide you “standard service”, which means the electric distribution utility – AEP Ohio – is required to buy generation on your behalf.

AEP Ohio passes these charges through dollar-for-dollar and makes no money from them. For your rate schedule, the standard service rate is currently \$0.105/kWh. That means a generation provider must offer you a rate lower than \$0.105/kWh for you to save money.
